An internet search finds the claim: "US adult male heights are on average 70 inches (5'10") with a standard deviation of 4 inches." The fraction F of such adult males within one standard deviation of the mean value ("average") for a normal distribution is given by the following definite integral

$$F = \int_{66}^{74} \frac{1}{4\sqrt{2\pi}} e^{-\frac{1}{2} \cdot \left(\frac{x - 70}{4}\right)^2} dx$$

- a) Use Maple to evaluate this exactly and then approximate the result to 3 decimal places.
- b) Use the change of variable to the "standard variable" $u = \frac{x 70}{4}$ to transform this definite integral to its standard form in terms of that new variable (which measures the deviation from the average value in multiples of the standard deviation).
- c) Use Maple to evaluate the new integral exactly and then approximate it to 3 decimal places.
- d) They should agree. If not find your error.
- e) What percent of this population has a height within one standard deviation of the mean value of 70? Answer in a complete English sentence.
